## WORLD HYPERTENSION DAY

World Hypertension Day was organized on May 13, 2015 at Jinnah Medical & Dental College. Dr HR. Ahmad delivered a lecture on Hypertension. He emphasized the questions regarding epidemiology of hypertension in Pakistan that needs to be addressed. These are: 1) what percentage of a population is suffering from hypertension? 2) what percentage do not know that they have hypertension? 3) what percentage are not treated? 4) what percentage are not optimally treated? Unless, we know the answers of these questions through good studies, we will be not be doing justice to the public health system. Since Hypertension is a multi factorial disease, these are non modifiable and modifiable risk factors to be identified to peruse preventive medicine. Students displayed the importance of the day by making posters and presenting a skit.







## NO TOBACCO DAY

Tobacco kills millions of people throughout the world. Every year, on 31st May, WHO marks World No Tobacco Day, highlighting the enormous health risk associated with tobacco use. Considering importance of the subject, Jinnah Medical and Dental College organized a guest lecture by Professor Dr. Syed Muhammad Mubeen, Vice Principal Hamdard College of Medicine & Dentistry and Head, Department of Community Health Sciences. Dr. Mubeen in his presentation titled "Tobacco - Road Map to Death" highlighted how tobacco entered the Asian Sub-continent. He briefed the epidemiology of tobacco use and the reasons of its popularity especially during adolescence. He made



emphasis on the pivotal role of medical students and doctors in tobacco control. The presenter further revealed illustratively to the audience about the effects of tobacco use (smoking and chewing tobacco) on the human body.

#### TIPS FOR PREVENTING HEAT-STROKE

#### THE BEST DEFENSE IS PREVENTION. SOME PREVENTION TIPS:

- Drink more fluids regardless of your activity level. Do not wait until you are thirsty to drink. Warning: If your doctor
  generally limits the amount of fluid you drink or has you on water pills, ask him how much you should drink while
  the weather is hot
- Do not drink liquids that contain alcohol or large amounts of sugar; these actually cause you to lose more body fluid. Avoid very cold drinks, because they can cause stomach cramps
- Stay indoors and, if at all possible, stay in an air-conditioned place. If your home does not have air conditioning, go to the shopping mall or public library-even a few hours spent in air conditioning can help your body stay cooler when you go back into the heat. Call your local health department to see if there are any heat-relief shelters in your area.
- Electric fans may provide comfort, but when the temperature is in the high 90s, fans will not prevent heat-related illness. Take a cool shower or bath
- Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing
- Never leave anyone in a closed, parked vehicle
- Although any one at any time can suffer from heat-related illness, some people are at greater risk than others.
   Check regularly on Infants and young children, people aged 65 or older, people who have a mental illness and those who are physically ill, especially with heart disease or high blood pressure

#### IF YOU MUST BE OUT IN THE HEAT

- Limit your outdoor activity to morning and evening hours
- Cut down on exercise. If you must exercise, drink two to four glasses of cool, nonalcoholic fluids each hour. A sports beverage can replace the salt and minerals you lose in sweat
- Warning: If you are on a low-salt diet, talk with your doctor before drinking a sports beverage
- Try to rest often in shady areas
- Protect yourself from the sun by carrying an umbrella, wearing a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses and by putting
  on sunscreen of SPF 15 or higher (the most effective products say "broad spectrum" or "UVA/UVB protection" on
  their labels)
