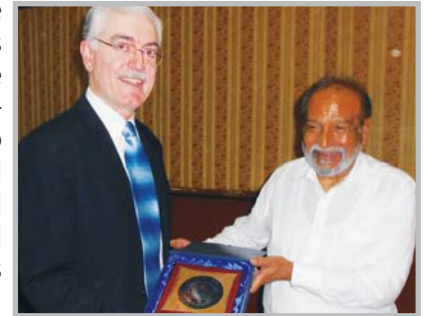
World Heart Day

To commemorate World Heart Day, informative lecture "Are Quality Outcomes Achievable in the Management of Coronary Artery Disease?" by Dr. Hasanat Sharif, Associate Professor of Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery, AKUH, was held on September 13, at JMDC. He presented, evidence based data comparing local outcomes with international standards. Dr. Sharif stressed the importance of preventive cardiology in the setting of a developing country like Pakistan and emphasized that without raising public awareness about a healthy lifestyle, the battle against cardiovascular diseases can not be won.



Heart Valve Repair Surgery

Dr. Sulaiman B. Hasan, Head of Cardio-Thoracic Surgery, AKUH, delivered a lecture on 'Heart Valve Repair Surgery' on August 9. Mitral valve repair is a novel technique with better patient outcomes but technically is more challenging. Dr. Hasan presented, evidence based data comparing the outcomes of mitral valve repair versus replacement. He also gave an in-depth insight into different surgical techniques used in both mitral and aortic valves repair.



TRIBUTE TO DR. HABIBA HASAN

On June 21, Pakistan Medical Association, organized a program to pay tribute and to celebrate the services rendered by Dr. Habiba Hasan, JMCH, Pediatrics Consultant. Apart from her professional commitments as a clinician and an academician, her pursuits as an activist are evident from her being a founder member of organizations such as ACELP (Association Of Children With Emotional & Learning Disabilities), AURA (Al Umeed Rehabilitation Association) and SHAP (Speech & Hearing Association Of Pakistan), which also started the first BS program in speech therapy. She is the first person from the Indo-Pak and first ever muslim women to get elected on the international executive committee of Amnesty International, this being its highest body. Her commitment resonates in her work as a focal person to improve the conditions in women & juvenile jails and raising a voice for women & children rights. For women in danger of honor killing & domestic violence, she with companions founded a shelter home named "Panah" and was one of the two lead persons for gender sensitivity training program in Sindh for judiciary and law enforcing agencies. She is a founder member of HERP (Human Rights Education Program) and headed the Medical Aid Committee of Bazm-e-Amna for over 15 years. She received a shield from Dr. Uqailiee of PMA in recognition for outstanding humanitarian services rendered.

The World Heart Day Celebration on September 17 was dedicated to memory of Prof Dr. S. M. Rab. Dr. Zainab Hasan, Co-ordinator, Community Medicine, facilitated a focus group of participants. The objective was to obtain consensus on how we can introduce physical activity, healthy dietary practices and tobacco control at our institute. Participants included representatives of the faculty, supporting departments and students. A consensus was developed that we will encourage each other to use stairs instead of elevator at least for one or two floors and in order to promote this habit signs will be put on elevator doors encouraging use of stairs. The need to maintain a regular 30 minute/5 day a week exercise regime was highlighted which will be supported by the upcoming rehabilitation gym at the campus. To promote a healthy diet, cafeteria operators will be asked to make available fruit, yoghurt, bran bread, nuts and green tea for healthy heart choice. Participants vowed to limit meal sizes and white flour in their homes. It was reaffirmed JMDC is already a tobacco free zone. Additionally, students of MBBS IV year learnt about risk factor modification as part of their module based curriculum. Students symbolically wore red outfits for the day.
