JMDC GUEST LECTURE SERIES MOLECULAR GENETIC BASIS OF EPILEPSY

Dr Fazal Arain, Department of Biological and Biomedical Sciences, AKUH, delivered a lecture on Molecular Genetic Basis of Epilepsy on May 12, 2014. He discussed various aspects of genetic variations in epilepsy and emphasized that research can contribute more in the diagnosis and treatment of epilepsy.



Dr Shahid Pervez, Department of Pathology & Microbiology, AKUH, gave a presentation on Carcinogenesis: How to Protect the Blue Print of Life (DNA) on April 12, 2014. He Informed that DNA is a fragile molecule that is continually under assault from agents in the environment, our diet & even from normal processes that takes place within the cell. He discussed various rules to avoid cancer i.e. Do not smoke, avoid exposure to carcinogens, low calorie diet, eat fresh fruits & vegetables, be physically active, avoid overweight, prevent and treat cancer related infections, have the right gene and have LUCK.



Dr Sveda Sadia Fatima (JMDC Alumni), Dept. of Biological and Biomedical Sciences, AKUH, shared the informative session on Obesity Paradigms in Pakistan on June 14, 2014. She highlighted the body composition, nutrition and active lifestyle and their incorporation in routine life.

44 IMPLANTS IN A WEEK

Dr Montasir Junaid, Assit Prof, Otolaryngology (ENT), JMDC, along with Pakistan Cochlear Implant Team performed 44 implants in a week from March 29 to April 5, 2014 at Lahore. In any big center of the world no more then 20-25 implants/ year are being done. The Cochlear implant it self is a miracle of science which enables the deaf and mute children (congenital/acquired) to regain this precious sense of communication .The Cochlear Implant operation last for 1.5 hours (approx.) and can be performed as a day care procedure. The Implant has specialized





electrodes which are inserted in the cochlea via mastoid approach. Once inserted the Audiologist checks for the integrity of channels corresponding to different sound levels in the O.T. After the initial time of 4-8weeks, the implant is switched on, and with the passage of time the child undergoes therapy to understand the sounds received and practices verbal exercises. We congratulate Dr Montasir for his achievement.
